Dr. Farhan Nizami is the founding Director of the Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies and the Prince of Wales Fellow in the Study of the Islamic World at Magdalen College, Oxford. The Oxford Centre for Islamic Studies is a recognized Independent Centre of the University of Oxford. It was established in 1985 to encourage the scholarly study of Islam and the Islamic world. HRH The Prince of Wales is the Patron of the Centre, which is governed by a Board of Trustees consisting of scholars and statesmen from different parts of the world, alongside representatives of the University of Oxford.

Dr. Nizami is Editor of the Journal of Islamic Studies, he is a member of Oxford's Faculties of Modern History and Oriental Studies. Educated at the Aligarh Muslim University and at *Wadham College*, Oxford University, he became a Fellow of Oxford's St. Cross College in 1983 and subsequently a Fellow in Islamic Studies. Upon his move to Magdalen College, he was elected to an Emeritus Fellowship at St. Cross. He is currently working on an atlas of Muslim social and intellectual history forthcoming from Oxford University Press.
